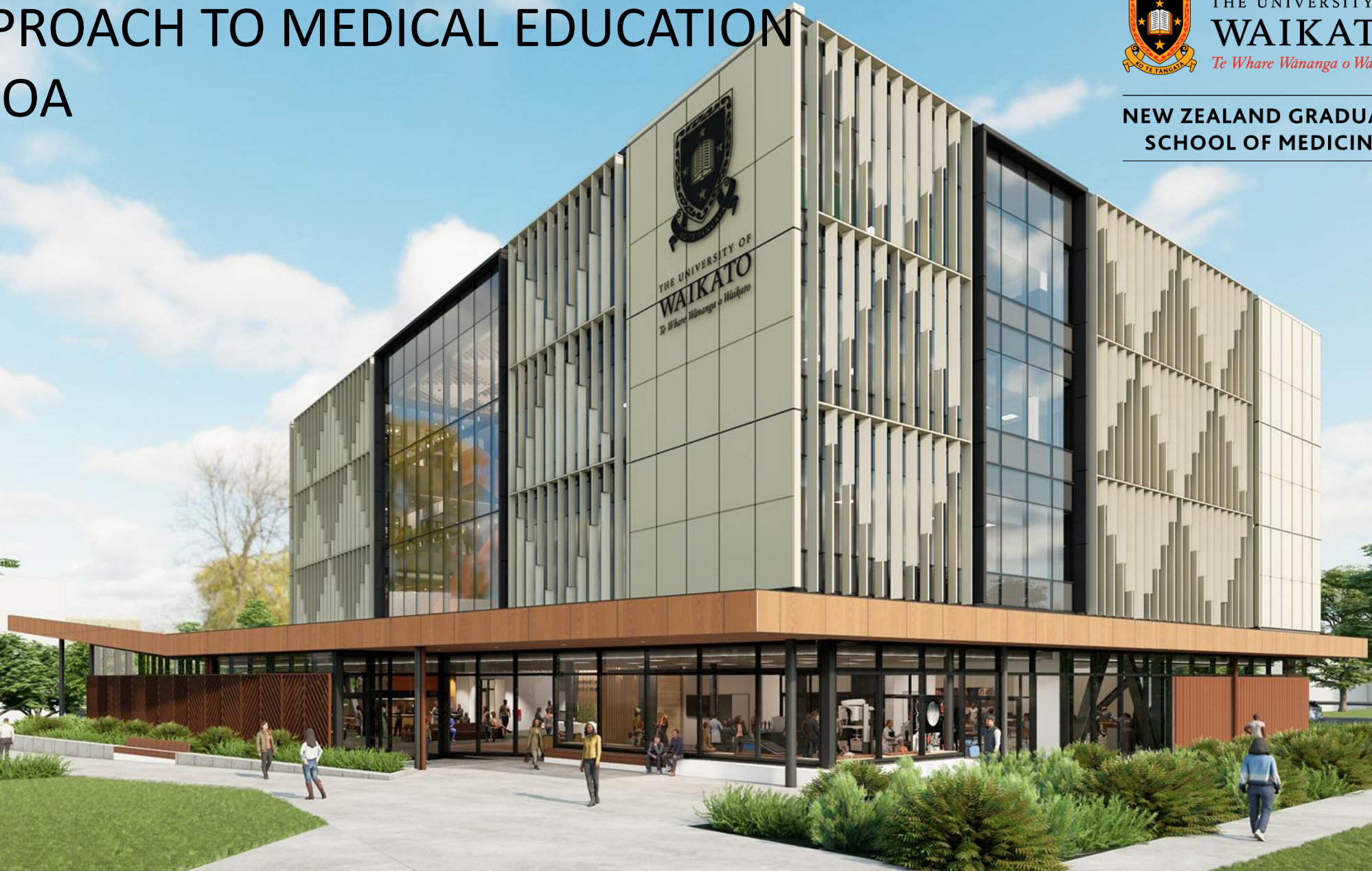

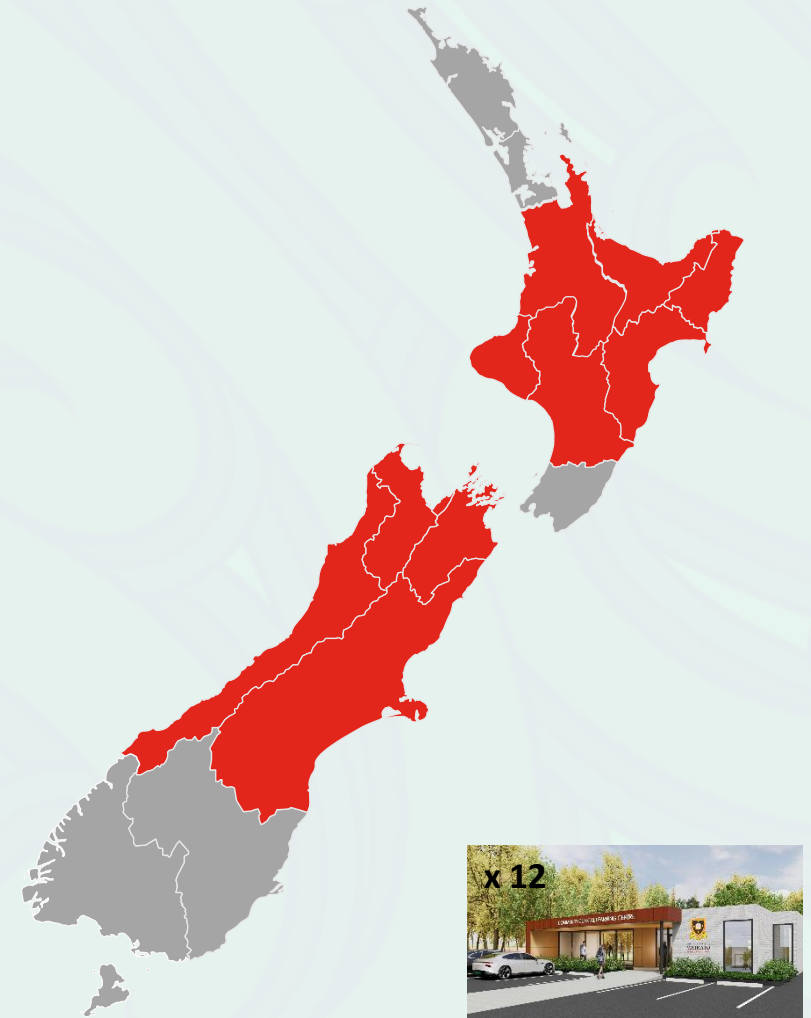

- A balanced clinical placement programme across hospital and primary care settings

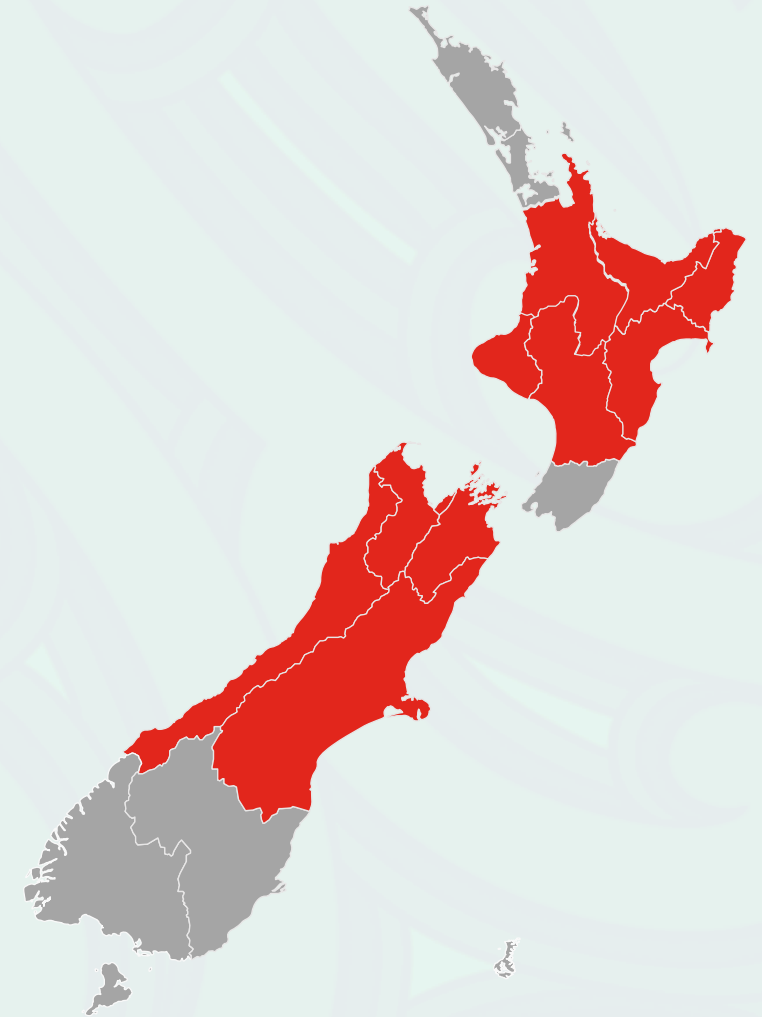

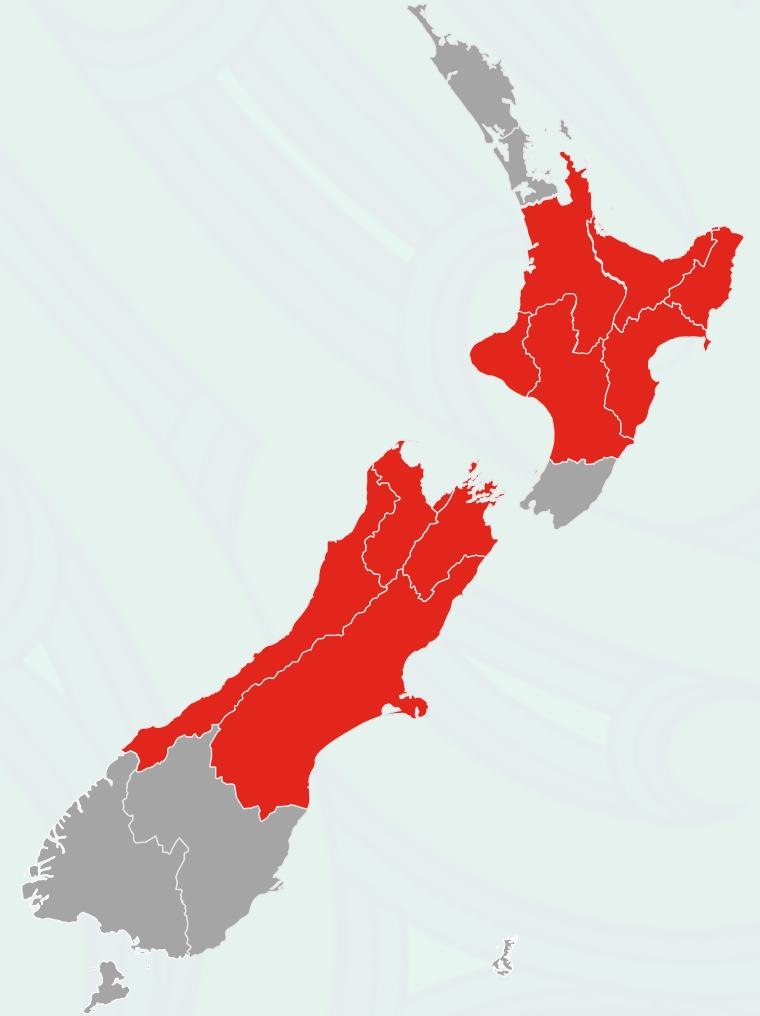

Community Clinical Learning Centres

- **Four CCLCs for Tainui waka** (Ngāruawahia, Rāhui Pokeka, Whaingaroa, Te Awamutu/Otorohanga, Te Kuiti, Pukekohe/Waiuku, Tokoroa/Putaruru, Matamata/Piako and Hauraki)
- **One CCLC each for:** (Taupo/Tūrangi **Rotorua**, Tauranga/Te Puke/Whakatāne, Te Tairāwhiti, Whanganui, Ahuriri/Heretaunga, Papaioea/Levin/Feilding, and Taranaki)
- Te Wai Pounamu (x2 CCLCs)

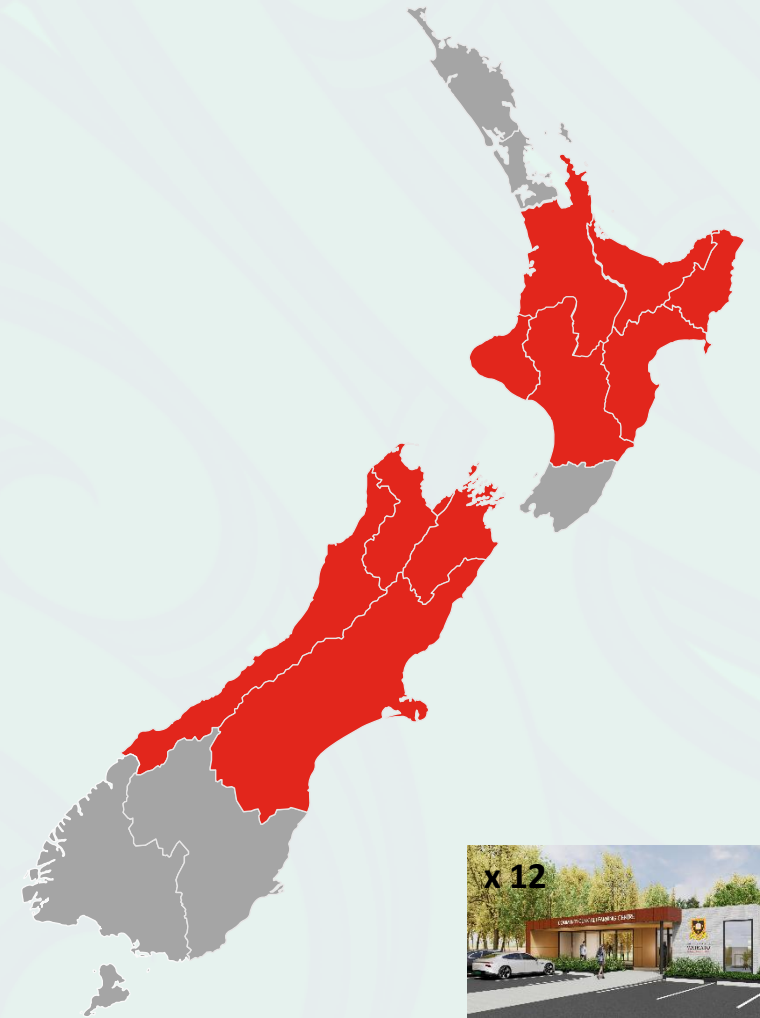
Community Clinical Learning Centres

- 12 satellite campuses in communities of 15,000-50,000
- Facilities for group learning activities
- Provide holistic student and whānau support while on placement
- New build, refurbish, lease options



Community Clinical Learning Centres

- Circa 200m² floor area, potentially less if amenities are shared rather than exclusive to the CCLC
- Circa 800m² total land area to enable sufficient car parks. Proximate car parking may reduce the required land area
- If leased by UoW, the initial lease term of circa eight years, with rights of renewal for another circa four years
- The site to have a profile, university branded
- Within a commercial zone in a district plan
- Fibre for quality internet connectivity
- Meet or exceed the govt seismic requirements for area

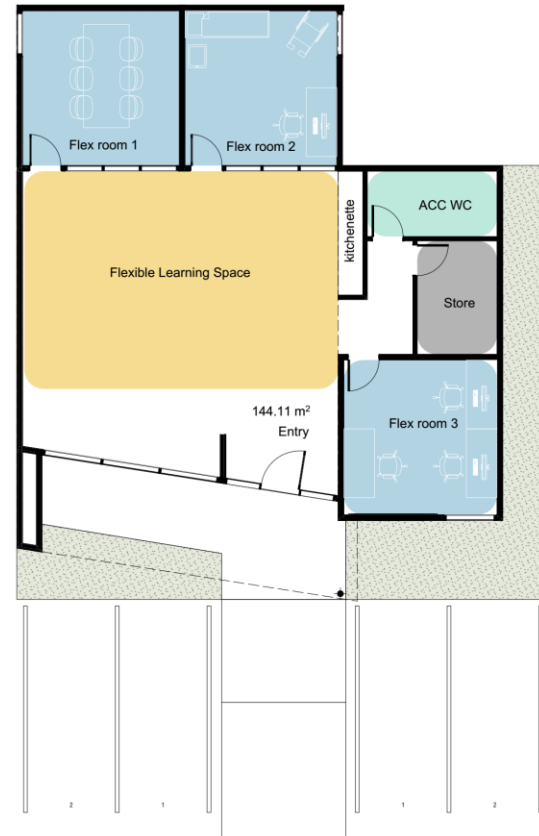

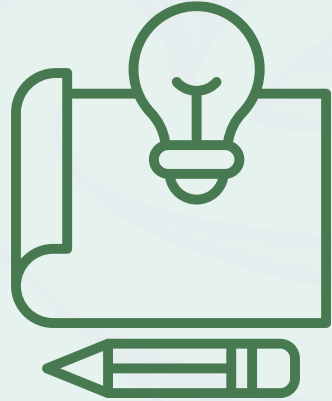

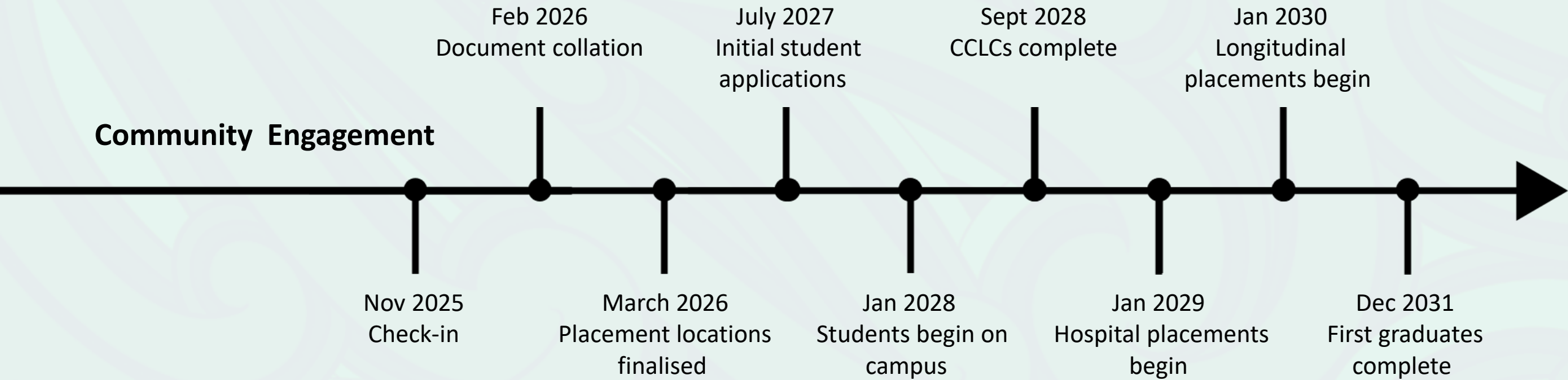
